# A Portal for sharing knowledge and inspiring collaborative action on gender and science

GenPORT (www.genderportal.eu) is an EU FP7 project coordinated by the Open University of Catalonia (Spain), with PORTIA (UK), Fondazione Giacomo Brodolini (Italy), Universitas de Matthiae Belli (Slovakia), Örebro Universitet (Sweden) and GESIS (Germany) as partners.

GenPORT is a community sourced internet portal, offering an open collaborative environment for exchanging resources and knowledge on gender across all sciences, ie natural and social sciences, and humanities.

This online community is composed of researchers, practitioners and policy-makers

across the globe interested in gender equality and excellence in science, technology and innovation. The portal addresses both experts and non-expert on gender alike.

your journal, authors or for yourself. A good example is the SAGER (Sex and Gender Equality in Research) Guidelines elaborated by the EASE Gender Policy Committee.

- Upload articles of your journals and make them known within the community on gender and science.
- Discover research across the disciplines which integrates a sex and gender dimensions. These provide concrete examples how gender can boost the quality of research outcomes in such diverse areas as physics, climate action or transport.
- Identify guidelines, measures and good practices of how gender diversity in teams can be promoted in order to assure gender equality in research organisations.
- Take part of E2E (expert to expert) data base so that others can easily find you and your expertise on gender.
- Be involved in the activities of the GenPORT community as a participant or as organizer of a new group to start to discuss specific topics on gender and science with a global community.
